The Situation in Valencia & Social Corporate responsibility

Following the tragic events that occurred in the southern area of Valencia on October 29th and 30th, we would like to reassure all attendees of our congress that it is completely safe to travel to Valencia.

The city itself was not affected by the flooding; only towns and villages to the south of the city were impacted. As can be seen on the official tourism website of the city (<u>www.visitvalencia.com</u>), Valencia is fully prepared to move forward, and tourism can play a key role in supporting the area's recovery.

We understand the sense of helplessness many of us felt upon seeing the devastating images of the disaster. We want that empathy to translate into tangible support for those who have lost everything. For this reason, the congress organizers have reached out to a local public school in the town of Catarroja (Joan XXIII School) to help them get back on their feet.

The school's early childhood education area (for children ages 3 to 5) was severely damaged, as it was located on the ground floor, which was completely destroyed by the floods. They are in urgent need of donations of educational materials for young children.

What is Needed:

- Building blocks and pieces (preferably wooden)
- Dolls for symbolic play (people, objects, preferably wooden)
- Piolicubes, dominoes, puzzles, and basic games for children ages 3 to 5
- Storybooks (in English or Spanish)
- Alphabet letters for manipulation
- Materials for learning ABN (The Open Algorithm Based on Numbers method)
- Toy cars
- Rugs/ Carpets
- Logic games

Please bring any of the listed materials you wish to donate to the congress. (Note: We will not be accepting monetary donations.) We will collect the items during the registration on Monday and deliver them directly to the school after the congress.

Your support will make a real difference in helping these children return to their normal routines and continue their education in the wake of this catastrophe.

How to get to the campus





Metro

The closest metro station to Campus Turia is **Turia**. However, we recommend checking the official Metro Valencia website as some lines are still affected due to the flooding caused by the DANA weather event.

Home - Metrovalencia

We apologize for any inconvenience caused by the fact that some metro lines have not yet been fully restored, but there are alternative bus routes available.

National Buses

The Valencia Central Bus Station is located just 11 minutes on foot from Campus Turia. This station connects Valencia with almost all cities across Spain. <u>Estación de Autobuses de Valencia - Comunitat Valenciana</u>

City Buses

The closest city bus lines to the campus are 28 and C1, which stop directly in front of the university and the IVAM Museum. www.emtvalencia.es/ciudadano/index.php?lang=en

From Train Stations

Valencia has two main train stations:

- Estación del Norte: From here, you can either walk to the campus (about 15 minutes) or take bus lines C1 or 28.
- **Joaquín Sorolla:** The campus is a 35-minute walk from this station, or you can take bus line 64.

Parking

Parking in the area around the campus can be challenging. If traveling by private car, it is recommended to park near the bus station area and then walk to the campus.

FREE 72-hour public transport card

Thanks to the generosity of our main sponsor, Visit Valencia, each event attendee will receive a 72-hour public transport card for free use within the city. This card will be provided on the first day of the congress during registration.

Guidelines for workshop paper presenters



Timing

Each workshop presentation at the conference has been allocated 30 minutes, unless the workshop chair reports otherwise. This means 15 minutes for your presentation and 15 minutes for discussion. Please do not overrun the 15 minutes presentation, as this limits the time available for discussion and may limit the time available for the presentations that follow. Workshop chairs have been instructed to apply the 30 minutes time limits to all papers.

Format

Each workshop session will include a discussion session, giving the audience time to react to the papers presented. In your presentation, please try to concentrate on the major issues which your paper raises, rather than the presentation or too much factual background. Delegates will be able to read this information for themselves either after the presentation or in the conference publication.

Audio-visual equipment

All workshop rooms are equipped with a computer and a projector to be used for Power Point presentations.

Publication of abstracts and extended abstracts/working papers

All abstracts and extended abstracts/working papers have been published in the abstract. This book will be sent in PDF to all registered participants before the conference. During the conference it will also be available ONLINE behind the QR code.

Full paper

Following the conference, papers may be submitted for publication in a special edition of the Journal of Convention and Event Tourism, based entirely on papers from our conference. Full details of the submission and review process will be given in Valencia.
